

CORONER REPORT

The circumstances around the death were that Braden had recently moved here just two days ago to start football at the Garden City Community College. He had his first day of practice today. He was behaving normally. I spoke with the football Coach and well as athletic trainers who state that he was able to participate without issue in football practice and was behaving normally and they spoke to him. Practice got over about 9:15 pm and they needed to go to a meeting. At that time the patient, instead of walking towards the meeting, started to walk towards his dorm room. He was refusing to answer the athletic trainer. The meeting got over about 09:30p.m. Around 09:45p.m. he was found lying just outside his dorm room lying with his head against the brick wall and was unconscious and unresponsive and a bystander described him as sounding like he was choking and had threw up coffee ground emesis and sounded like he was snoring. Emergency Medical Services were notified and they quickly took the patient to the emergency department. I spoke with the emergency department physician who states that the patient had a pulse and was obtunded but with drawing from pain and had multiple episodes of coffee ground emesis. Because of this, he was immediately intubated by emergency department and they state that shortly after this they lost vital signs and began resuscitative measures. They performed multiple rounds of epinephrine and coded the patient for quite some time before calling it after they never got a pulse back. They stated that they had done five round of epinephrine amongst other interventions. He states that chest x-ray had been obtained, and by the history and the chest x-ray he had aspirated a large amount of emesis.

Emergency department physician identified the body and the determination was made that the decedent was in fact dead at 23:06, after asystole on heart monitor and no signs indicated that cardio pulmonary resuscitation were being effective.


Identity was establish using presumptive identification measures with physical identification by coaches and football staff as well as identification of personal effects associated with his body.

Description of the body: the patient is a black male 6'4" 136 kilos. He was fully clothed. There was no evidence of injury or blood stain patterns on the body that were not directly attributed to his emesis. I did not identify any signs of struggle. There are no petechial hemorrhages on the face or eyes. No scratching or defensive marks. No fingernail marks or abrasions. No contusions around the decedent's neck or ligature marks. No evidence of apparent drug use with needle marks.

Liver mortis was consistent with the body position lying on the emergency department bed and fluid.

Rigor mortis was fully developed in the finger, jaw, hip and knee. Algor mortis the patients' extremities were cool to the touch, but central body was warm. The manner of death appears to be undetermined at this time. The information I have about the nature of the patients' death at this time is insufficient and determination will be made after awaiting autopsy and toxicology results. Autopsy was ordered and will be performed locally.

The cause of death is unable to be established and is pending autopsy results. Disposition of the body, is again, autopsy.
